What is a Junior Golf Grant?

Defined as: Financial support for families to help their children learn to compete, develop skills, enhance core values and build lasting relationships through the game of golf.

Eligibility

- Children must be 18 years old or younger, not having entered college
- Families are residents of the Greater Sacramento Area defined as a 50 mile radius of Haggin Oaks Golf Complex
- Junior golfer must have a history of actively participating in the game of golf

Grant Funding

Each award will be based upon individual need. Eligible families will be reimbursed, to the extent of the Grant dollars awarded, for the following expenses:

- Tournament registration fees
- Transportation to and from tournaments deemed as travel tournaments for junior golfer only
- Lodging and meal costs for junior golfer only in travel tournaments
- Other expenses as dictated by USGA rules

MGF Grants will only reimburse expenses that are eligible under USGA and NCAA rules. Grantee and/or parents are responsible for maintaining eligibility.

Steps to Grant

- 1. Fill out application
- 2. Eligible applicants will be scheduled for interviews
- 3. After interview all applicants will be notified as to the final determination of the Grant
- 4. Grant recipients will be scheduled for a "Let's Get Started" meeting



FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions)

- Q: How is a family's need determined?
- A: Through the application and interview process.
- Q: Are there minimum golf abilities required for a grant application?
- A: Yes, junior golfers must have a history of active participation in the game of golf.
- Q: What defines a junior golfer?
- A: An amateur golfer, not 19 years old by

 December 31st of the calendar year prior
 to a competition requiring that golfer be
 a junior in order to partipate.
- Q: How often can a family apply for a grant?
- A: Annually
- Q: What is the time period from application to decision?
- A: Not to exceed 8 weeks.
