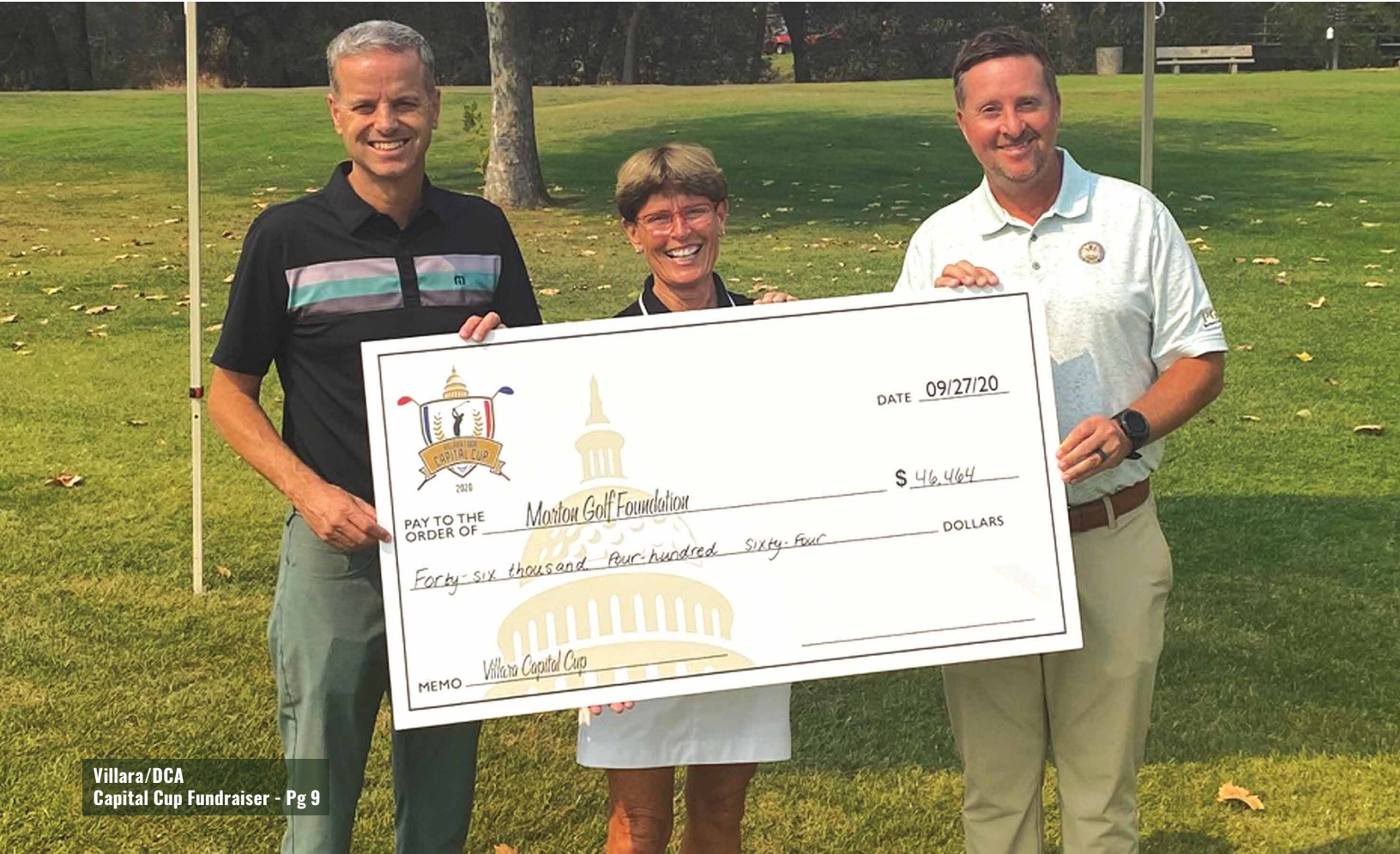

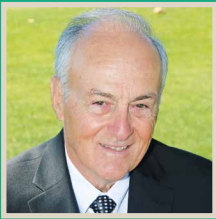

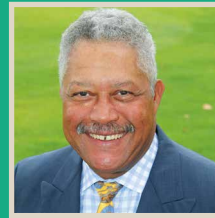

# PGA HOPE

## Helping veterans is par for the course

**Nearly every hour in the U.S., a veteran takes their own life. It's an awful reality that is sobering, and hard to understand, and gut-wrenchingly real. The fact is that suicide is a major issue in the veteran community. Statistics show that 22 veterans each day commit suicide. It's 22 too many.**

Five years ago, with those devastating statistics in mind, the Northern California PGA Foundation identified a growing need for veteran support. It was clear that the region's nearly 377,000 veterans were underserved, and they set out to create a therapeutic golfing program that could change the narrative – and with it, the lives of thousands of at-risk veterans.

PGA HOPE (Helping Our Patriots Everywhere), a partnership program between the PGA of America and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs was adopted by the NCPGA Foundation in 2015. The therapeutic and mental health benefits of the PGA HOPE clinics are apparent, and for veterans it's the catalyst for life-changing impact. This year, it was almost taken away. The impact of COVID-19 has been far-reaching, and it affected PGA HOPE and its efforts to provide ongoing veteran support. Program sites had to shut down all around the Bay Area. Thankfully, golf in Sacramento remained open.

Haggin Oaks Golf Complex in Sacramento is home to one of the largest PGA HOPE Northern California clinic sites, serving a demographic that is mainly retired, low to moderate income, fighting post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), or other

health recovery challenges. Since Spring 2016, Haggin Oaks has hosted 230 veterans.

PGA HOPE, which is FREE to veterans, works a little something like this:

Each clinic has about 30 veteran participants. Over the course of six weeks of professionally-led classes with PGA instructors, they learn the game of golf. Veterans are split into three groups – Alpha, Bravo, and Charlie – with stations like chipping, putting, and a full swing driving range. Understandably, many golf balls are shanked and divots created, but that's half the experience of golfing. On graduation day veterans receive a golf shirt and starter clubs, if needed, to get them on their way.

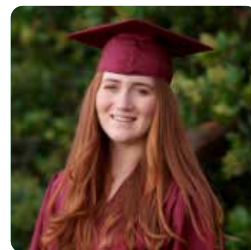
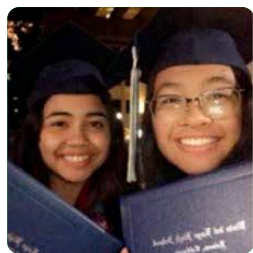
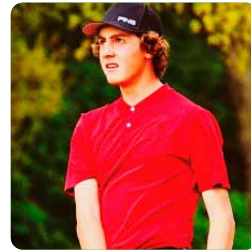
For the veterans served, though, there are more benefits than simply learning the game. PTSD, in particular, can be a very debilitating and isolating condition. Many individuals struggling with the disorder have difficulty getting out of their homes and socializing with others. Through PGA HOPE, they're connected with other veterans facing similar challenges or hardships – they become PGA HOPE family.

Call it a hole-in-one, an ace, or just being on your A-game – the Morton Golf Foundation stepped up to provide the NCPGA Foundation and the veterans they serve with a \$10,000 grant to fund participation at the Haggin Oaks PGA HOPE clinic. We'll call helping our patriots everywhere a job well done!

## Capital Cup Fundraiser

### September 25, 26 & 27, 2020

This year due to COVID-19 most fundraisers were cancelled for Morton Golf Foundation.

Morton Golf Foundation is a fundraising board that gives back to other 501c3 non-profits.

Luckily, Tom Morton, President of Morton Golf Foundation stepped up to the plate and entered to play in the 6th Annual Villara/DCA Capital Cup fundraiser.

The event this year involved 28 golfers of all abilities playing matches over a 3-day period for the charity of their choice. Friday, September 25th, Winchester Country Club, Saturday, September 26th Del Paso Country Club and the final day, Sunday, September 27th, North Ridge Country Club.

When Tom Morton signed up to play for Morton Golf Foundation, Tom along with all board members went to their friends, family, and contacts for financial support through donations. Morton Golf Foundation started off with having 2 months to reach a donation goal of \$20,000.00. In that 2-month period over 107 people donated to Morton Golf Foundation to support our mission of giving back to local youth, disabled and underserved. Out of the 28 players in this event Morton Golf Foundation had the greatest number of donations given!

On the final day Morton Golf Foundation's donations totaled \$40,020.00. In Tom's golf match on the final day he had the opportunity to collect even more money by winning his match. Tom added on to the final day an additional \$6,444.00 to bring up the total raised for Morton Golf Foundation to \$46,464.00!



The donations will go toward other non-profits, junior golf development grants and college scholarships as Morton Golf Foundation continues to meet their mission of raising funds for golf programs in the Greater Sacramento community that instill character building values. Morton Golf Foundation would like to thank all the sponsors of the Villara / DCA Capital Cup who contributed to such an amazing event raising a total of 1.8 million dollars for the Sacramento community!

# MGF Junior Golf Development Grant Program Continues to Grow and Getting Stronger!

As the 6th year of the Junior Golf Development Grant Program is completed, we are happy and proud to say this program is growing and evolving to support even more junior golfers' reach their goals and dreams!

During the 6 years of existence, MGF has awarded 124 Junior Golf Development Grants and almost \$190,000.

The mission of this program is to provide financial support for families to help their children learn to compete, develop skills, enhance core values and build lasting relationships through the game of golf. We also provide direction to parents and juniors who are trying to navigate the difficult maze of tournament play, coaching and equipment.

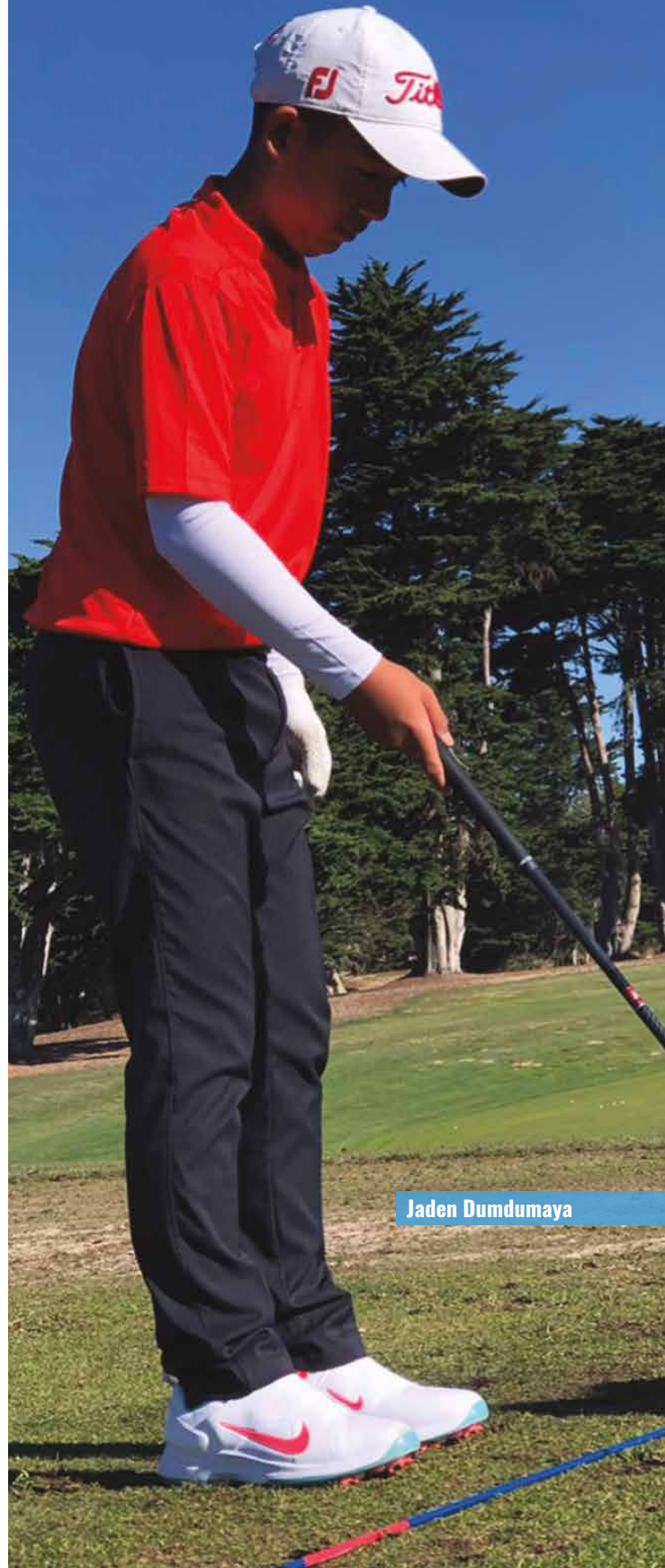
How the Grant works: Juniors who have a history of playing the game of golf can go to the MGF website [mortongolffoundation.org](http://mortongolffoundation.org) click on "how we help", click on youth opportunities, scroll down to MGF Junior Golf Development Grant, fill out the application and submit.

Once the application is received, the MGF Grant Selection Committee will set up an interview date. During this interview: questions are asked both of parents and junior player, golf history is reviewed, golf wish list is discussed, and a golf abilities worksheet is examined.

Once the interview is completed, the Grant Selection committee in concert with the junior's family creates a financial support plan that fits the need of each family awarded a grant. Support plans may reinforce tournament play, assist golf lesson costs or help defray the expense of new equipment. Each support plan is designed to fit the greatest needs of the individual family and junior golfer.

One of the key values of the MGF Junior Golf Development Grant Program is to ensure each junior golfer is having fun while learning and growing in the game of golf! To that end, each year MGF holds a junior golf tournament named The Sacramento Junior Golf Marathon "100 holes of Golf" at the Bing Maloney Express 9 course. The goal is to play 100 holes as fast as possible, no score, no lost balls, no winners or losers. Just a fun event with family and friends. This event is also a fundraiser where junior golfers ask for donations from friends and family to support the MGF Junior Golf Development Grant Program. Over the last 4 years the juniors have raised over \$15,000 to support their own cause!

Learning core values, growing golf abilities and giving back to the community, now that's a program we can all get behind!

# Youth on Course Opportunities

Since its founding in 2006 as the charitable arm of the Northern California Golf Association, the core purpose of Youth on Course as a nonprofit organization has been to provide youth ages 6-18 with access to life-changing opportunities through golf. We do this through subsidized rounds of golf so that youth can play for \$5 or less at 1,400+ courses nationwide, offering a Careers on Course program where youth can learn to be caddies and interns while building personal and professional skillsets, and awarding more than \$250,000 annually in college scholarships. This year, with COVID-19 upending so many aspects of life—community, recreation, learning,



relationships—young people need these opportunities more than ever.

Thanks to the steadfast support for Youth on Course from the Morton

Golf Foundation, young people are getting engaged through golf in record numbers. This year, Youth on Course membership has skyrocketed to 100,000 (an increase of 30,000 since 2019) and members have played 75% more rounds of golf than in the previous year—that's almost 300,000 rounds!

## How did Covid-19 Impact the Growth of Golf?

In the middle of March this year, it was questionable whether playing golf was going to happen until the Covid-19 Pandemic was under control. Then in early April, after most golf courses furloughed most of their staffs, the Sacramento County Health Department stated that playing Golf was a great outdoor sport for exercise and if people distanced themselves and wore masks, golf was a recommended activity. Overnight, the number of people playing golf exploded. The great news was, lots of out of towners played Sacramento Golf Facilities, our regular golfers played more golf and lots of new golfers took up the game. During these uncertain times, bringing back staff to serve golfers became extremely difficult due to their comforting safety protocols for the good of the golfing public and for our employees. By early May, people wanted more golf instruction, more equipment and hundreds of juniors were taking up the game to be outdoors spending more time with Mom, Dad or Grandma and Grandpa. Tom Morton, President of the Morton Golf Foundation and the Director of Player

Development for Morton Golf's Northern California Institute of Golf brought his team of instructors together and completely redesigned all the programs at the City of Sacramento Golf Courses to conform with the everchanging safety protocols required by the State of California and County of Sacramento. He downsized the number of participants in each of the programs, made sure the teaching professionals and golfers wore masks and made sure the participants and instructors maintained at least 6 feet of distancing between themselves. In fact, the word was getting around about how comfortable the golfing public was at the City of Sacramento Golf Courses. Morton Golf began receiving calls from other golf courses throughout California and the nation as to what our policies were so they could implement them at their facilities.

Who would have believed that a pandemic would turn out to benefit the Growth of the Game of Golf? The game has always stated it is a game of a lifetime. In fact, there is a recent study stating that golfers who play most of their lives playing the game live 5 years longer than non-golfers. Golf is a healthy sport. It is outdoors. A golfer walks 5+ miles in an 18 Hole Round of Golf. Most of all, golf is a friendly social sport spending quality time with others. Because the game of golf has followed appropriate health protocols, it became one of the few activities during the pandemic where people can spend time together socializing and enjoying each other.

Even during the pandemic, it is important our supporters are aware that Morton Golf Foundation continues to support youth golfers with grants, college scholarships and support of those who are underserved as well as PGA HOPE (Helping Our Patriots Everywhere) and other disabled programs throughout our Greater Sacramento area. We are extremely thankful that Golf has been viewed as one of the healthiest outdoor sports during the pandemic and with so many people taking up the game from all walks of society, the future of the game of golf continues to look very exciting.



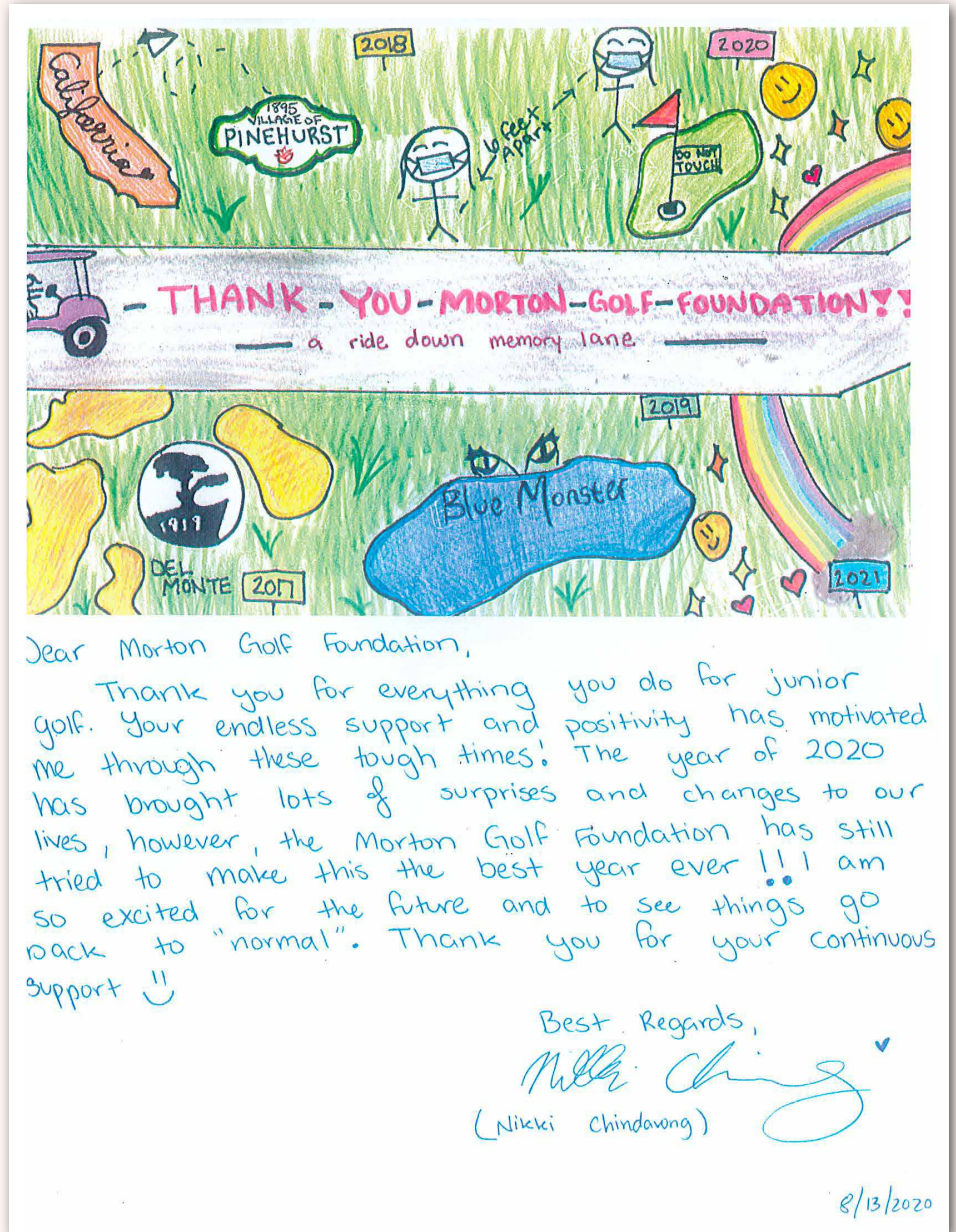
# JUNIOR THANK YOU'S
