One of the standout achievements of this year has been both our Hiram Johnson H.S. golf center project as well as our continued support of youth through scholarships and the golf grant program.

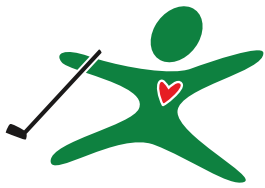
This has been instrumental in fostering a sense of community and belonging among participants, helping them build skills that extend far beyond the golf course.

L5 INVESTMENTS CAPITAL CUP FUNDRAISER SEPT 13-15, 2024

For the past ten years thirty-two golfers from our Greater Sacramento area have come together to play 3 days of golf to raise money for the charity of their choice.

Morton Golf Foundation was proud to have our President, Tom Morton playing for the Morton Golf Foundation. These golfers play golf 3-straight days in a Ryder Cup format with the winning team playing for an additional \$100,000 purse.

This year, Tom Morton along with the Morton Golf Foundation raised \$137,439 going directly back to local youth, adaptive and underserved.

Since the inception this event has raised \$18,105,209. This year alone these thirty-two players have raised \$2,626,522! The 2025 donation goal is set at raising over \$20million for the total 11 years.

The 2025 date for the 11th Annual L5 Capital Cup is set for September.

Morton Golf Foundation is looking forward to growing our charity dollars along with this event.

These are just a few categories. We have given over \$2.million dollars in over 16 years.

When Covid hit Morton Golf Foundation never missed a payment to give our Junior Golf Development Grants, College Scholarships or any non-profits to receive annual grant funding.

For every dollar given to MGF the minimum of \$.92 goes directly back to our youth, adaptive and underserved. The few dollars are needed to maintain an office & insurance.

JUNIOR GOLF DEVELOPMENT GRANTS PROGRAM

Our mission is to financially support families to help their children learn to compete, develop skills, enhance core values while building lasting relationships through the game of golf.

Morton Golf Foundation (MGF) does this by providing guidance with equipment purchase, tournament selection and coaching choices. Most importantly, when needed we can assist families on how to navigate the complex journey of junior golf. We are happy to report that through the 10-year history of the Junior Golf Development Grant over thirty-five juniors have earned golf related college scholarships. And, through fundraising efforts, \$400,000.00 in grants have been awarded to Sacramento Area Junior Golfers!



APPLYING FOR A MORTON GOLF FOUNDATION JUNIOR GOLF DEVELOPMENT GRANT IS EASY:

1. If you live within the designated area of Haggin Oaks Golf Complex as defined on the MGF website under ELIGIBILITY and are a junior golfer between the ages of 12 (by end of application period) and 18 (not enrolled in college). Please go to MGF website at www.mortongolffoundation.org. Put your cursor on How Can We Help, click on Youth Opportunities, scroll down to MGF Junior Golf Development Grant requirements and application, scroll down to the application. Fill out the application and hit Submit.
2. Once your application is received the MGF Interview Committee will schedule an interview for each applicant.
3. The Interview: Prior to the interview each applicant will receive several worksheets to complete. During the interview both parents and their junior golfer will be asked questions. As the interview progresses, using the completed worksheets, a golf plan is created specifically for each junior's needs.
4. When all junior applicants' interviews are completed, the MGF Interview Committee determines by individual junior applicant if the applicant receives a grant and the dollar amount of each grant. All applicants are notified of the MGF Interview Committee's decision.

The Morton Golf Foundation is looking forward to awarding more Junior Golf Development Grants in 2025!

HIRAM JOHNSON H.S. LIFE & GOLF SKILLS FACILITY RIBBON CUTTING

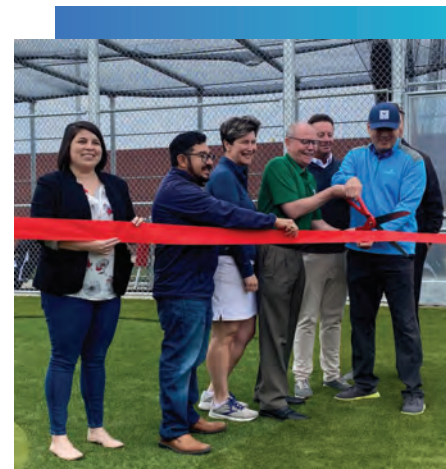
April 24th was a wonderful day at Hiram Johnson High School Life & Golf Skills Facility. For the past ten years a vision was created and now a reality has begun.

Angels for Hearts - "I ♥ Golf" Program 2024 | By Patric Wohl

In 2024, the "I ♥ Golf" program celebrated its 11th anniversary and marked its 10th season at Haggin Oaks, a partnership that has seen tremendous growth and impact. The program started with 24 participants. The program now has heart kids playing on high school golf teams and regularly participating in local youth golf programs supported by the Northern California Institute of Golf for Kids and The First Tee of Greater Sacramento. To ensure that "I ♥ Golf" participants have the opportunity to continue to play golf outside of our season, golfers are given GolferShips to help cover the costs of these golf programs.

The season began with 40 enthusiastic players looking to develop their golf skills. However, the "I ♥ Golf" community faced a heartbreaking loss when Ava Bolima, (age 17) one of the original golfers who started in the 1st grade, passed away unexpectedly. Ava was passionate about golf and had found her voice through the sport. She was poised to be one of the first "I ♥ Golf" participants to graduate high school this past June with a varsity letter in golf. Ava had just shared with us at the February "I ♥ Golf" Clinic she had plans to apply for the MGF scholarship and work at Haggin Oaks.

Despite the tragedy, the "I ♥ Golf" program decided to honor Ava's memory by dedicating the season to her. Her younger brother, Mason, continued playing in her memory, finding a sense of normalcy and joy through golf.

In the Fall of 2022, Joseph Castillo, a talented soccer player whose dreams were interrupted by a sudden diagnosis of a Congenital Heart Defect (CHD). Joseph was Introduced to golf through the "I ♥ Golf" program the same month he was told he could no longer play soccer. He quickly embraced the sport, becoming a skilled player in under 2 years. Joseph, a senior at Mira Loma High School, became the first recipient of the Ava Bolima Memorial Scholarship. Joseph was presented this scholarship at the 16th Annual Morton Golf Foundation Golf & Guitars Scholarship Night 2024. Ava was incredibly special to both Kim and Kelli, it just made sense to honor her through the game she loved.

We cannot be more grateful for the Morton Golf Foundation for their continued support of Angels for Hearts helping us grow our "I ♥ Golf" program each season. "I ♥ Golf" not only allows these kids to play golf but also builds a community where families can find hope, strength, and a sense of normalcy amid challenges. In 2023 we began offering golf lessons to "I ♥ Golf" Parents along with their kids. In the last two years, we have funded a series of golf lessons for 11 families. We are growing the game of golf one heart family at a time.

First Annual “Sacramento Junior Championship presented by Morton Golf Foundation”

In the fall of 2023, two members of the AJGA (American Junior Golf Association) came to Haggin Oaks to discuss with Morton Golf Foundation thoughts about hosting an AJGA junior tournament at Haggin Oaks.

Morton Golf Foundation had the vision of knowing they wanted to give junior golfers the opportunity to participate in the best competition at the most prestige junior tour in the United States right here in Sacramento. This allowed several junior golfers in Northern California the opportunity to sleep in their own bed and compete on a golf course they have competed on before. The seed was planted, and a five-year commitment contract was signed.

The first annual AJGA tournament was held at Haggin Oaks Golf Complex on the MacKenzie Golf Course on March 28 – 31, 2024. The field featured 96 juniors, ages 12-18, with a mixture of boys and girls. The excitement was overwhelming as the junior players anticipating that this tour has college coaches looking at the players in hope of offering college scholarships.

AJGA tournaments are played all around the United States. The AJGA is a non-profit organization dedicated to the overall growth and development of young men and women players. The mission of the AJGA Foundation mirrors the mission of Morton Golf Foundation. When AJGA staff stepped onto the property of Haggin Oaks and began working with the Morton Golf staff it was seamless in providing a first-class event.

We are all excited for the future AJGA events at Haggin Oaks as we continue to give junior golfers their opportunity to shine.
