

## CAPITAL CUP FUNDRAISER

### 2025 Results



32 local golfers choose a charity of their choice and fundraise for four months bringing charity dollars directly back to our Greater Sacramento area.

Since this tournament started 11 years ago just under \$21 million dollars has been raised. This year, with 32 participants the event raised \$2,700,000!

In 2025, two board members, Tom Morton, President and Uri Carrazco played in the event and both players were raising funds for Morton Golf Foundation.

There were 32 non-profits at the Awards Presentation that were very proud to go back to work the next day to continue the good work they do to make a difference in our community.

These are just a few categories. We have given over \$2.3 million dollars in over 17 years.

When Covid hit Morton Golf Foundation never missed a payment to give our Junior Golf Development Grants, College Scholarships or any non-profits to receive annual grant funding.

For every dollar given to MGF the minimum of \$.92 goes directly back to our youth, adaptive and underserved. The few dollars are needed to maintain an office & insurance.



# JUNIOR GOLF DEVELOPMENT GRANT PROGRAM


*A history of supporting junior golf by Rob Siebers*

The Morton Golf Foundation (MGF) has a history of supporting Junior Girls and Boys golf in the Greater Sacramento area for ages 12 through 18 years old. Over the past decade the Morton Golf Foundation has awarded 270 Junior Golf Development Grants to an estimated 100 deserving Junior Golfers in the Greater Sacramento area.

Approximately \$420,000 in grant support has been awarded over the past 17 years. These grants help support Junior Golfers in their efforts to both grow in the game of golf and learn life skills through the game of golf.

As a result, many of our Junior Golfers use Golf to earn their way into College Scholarships. In fact, almost half of our Grant winners earn College Scholarships.

## APPLYING FOR A MGF JUNIOR GOLF DEVELOPMENT GRANT IS EASY:

1. If you live within the designated area of Haggin Oaks Golf Complex as defined on the MGF website under ELIGIBILITY and are a junior golfer between the ages of 12 (by end of application period) and 18 (not enrolled in college). Please go to MGF website at [www.mortongolffoundation.org](http://www.mortongolffoundation.org). Put your cursor on How Can We Help, click on Youth Opportunities, scroll down to MGF Junior Golf Development Grant requirements and application, scroll down to the application. Fill out the application and hit Submit.
2. Once your application is received the MGF Interview Committee will schedule an interview for each applicant.
3. The Interview: Prior to the interview each applicant will receive several worksheets to complete. During the interview both parents and their junior golfer will be asked questions. As the interview progresses, using the completed worksheets, a golf plan is created specifically for each junior's needs.
4. When all junior applicants' interviews are completed, the MGF Interview Committee determines by individual junior applicant if the applicant receives a grant and the dollar amount of each grant. All applicants are notified of the MGF Interview Committee's decision.

## Angels for Hearts - “I ♥ Golf” Program 2025 | By Patric Wohl

When Angels for Hearts began as a simple project in 2006, no one could have imagined what it would grow into. Nearly two decades later, the nonprofit continues to touch lives in ways we never dreamed possible. In 2025, Angels for Hearts celebrated the 12th season of its “I ♥ Golf” program—a program designed specifically for children living with congenital heart defects (CHD) and their siblings. It’s also open to heart angel families because they are still a heart family.

“I’m humbled and amazed at how much “I ♥ Golf” has impacted the lives of our heart kids,” said founder Kimberly Kaufman.

“Hearing from parents about how it has truly changed their children’s lives still astonishes me. Sometimes I must stop and remind myself that we created something this special.”

For families navigating the challenges of CHD, the simple joys of childhood—can feel uncertain, even out of reach. That’s what makes “I ♥ Golf” unlike anything else. It’s not just about learning a sport; it’s about creating opportunities and removing barriers. Heart Parents are told their child will not be able to play sports. That philosophy changed thanks to one special pediatric cardiovascular surgeon Dr. Teimour Nasirov who supports patients playing golf. Dr. Nasirov was at one of Angels for Hearts events called ‘When I Grow Up.’ He shared with the golf professionals sharing what their occupation did; “that golf was the one sport heart kids could play.”

Take Iain’s story -

“When Iain was just two and a half, we learned he had inherited a rare cardiac gene that caused his heart to stop for terrifying seconds at a time,” shared his parents, Kevin and Moira Sinclair. “His journey has already included surgery and a pacemaker, with more procedures expected in the future. Like many families with children living with CHD, we wondered how he could ever enjoy the normal joys of childhood.

A classmate shared a flyer for the “I ♥ Golf” program. We signed up and have never looked back. Iain had just turned 8 years old; now he is almost 12. Golf quickly became more than a hobby—it became his passion. Through the program, he has traveled to courses he once only dreamed of, made lifelong friends, and competed in tournaments where he’s already earned medals and top finishes. Iain dreams of one day becoming a professional golfer—or giving back as a coach to help other kids discover the game of golf.

Most importantly, “I ♥ Golf” gave Iain something far more valuable than trophies: it gave him joy, confidence, and the chance to be a kid first—not just a heart patient.”

The impact of “I ♥ Golf” extends beyond individual stories. It’s not only about teaching kids to play, but also about showing them what’s possible. Angels for Hearts has built something truly one-of-a-kind.

Thanks to the support of partners like the Morton Golf Foundation, “I ♥ Golf” has become a lifeline of hope, health, and happiness for children and families who once wondered what “normal childhood” could look like. And year after year, the smiles on the course remind us: this program is about so much more than golf—it’s about giving kids the freedom to be kid which every child deserves. The dream is to make “I ♥ Golf” a national program, we hear from families out of state they wish our program was close by.

# WINNERS of the 2025



## SACRAMENTO JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP Presented by Morton Golf Foundation

Under sunny skies and amidst the towering heritage oaks of the Alister MacKenzie Golf Course at Haggin Oaks, two rising stars of junior golf claimed victory at the 2025 AJGA Sacramento Junior Championship presented by Morton Golf Foundation. Over three days of elite-level play, Rancho Santa Fe's Evan Liu and Atherton's Victoria Cui emerged as champions in a tournament that saw remarkable scoring and several strong performances from local Northern California's players.

In the Boys Division, 17-year-old Evan Liu from Rancho Santa Fe, CA held his nerve with a closing round 69 to finish at 16-under-par (66-65-69=200) and edge out Oregon's Drew Woolworth by a single shot. Liu's relentless consistency and poise under pressure were on full display, particularly during Sunday's final stretch, where he carded birdies on two of his final four holes to seal the title.

Woolworth, hailing from Lake Oswego, posted a superb 67 in the final round (66-68-67=201), but it wasn't quite enough to catch Liu.

Local standout Anita Lumpongpong of Sacramento showed resilience throughout the week, finishing a tie for 11th at even par (69-72-75=216). Also from the Sacramento area, Gianna Singh of Elk Grove surged with a final-round 68 to finish T16 at +2 (218), tying with Lily Peng of San Ramon.

This prestigious event took place on the historic Alister MacKenzie Golf Course at Haggin Oaks, a layout designed by the famed architect behind, Augusta National. Known for its strategic bunkering, large undulating greens, and canopy of heritage oaks, the course proved both a challenge and a showcase for some of the finest junior golfers in the country.

The American Junior Golf Association (AJGA), a national leader in junior golf development, has long made a tradition of spotlighting future collegiate and professional talent through its competitive event. With support from presenting sponsor Morton Golf Foundation, this week's championship not only delivered exciting golf, but also highlighted the continued commitment to supporting junior athletes through golf and education.
